Fairfield University Unveils New Arena Name



On September 28, Fairfield named the new \$51 million on-campus facility the Leo D. Mahoney Arena and celebrated the historic day with a cornerstone ceremony, filling a time

capsule with special messages and memories — from students, alumni, Trustees, and administrators — for future generations of Stags to access and read.

Wednesday, September 28, 2022 was a historic day for Fairfield University. University President Mark R. Nemec, PhD, announced that Fairfield's new \$51 million, 85,000-square foot arena is named the Leo D. Mahoney Arena. The 100-percent donor-funded arena which will officially open in November, replaces the institution's long-standing landmark Alumni Hall.

A leadership gift by Fairfield University Board of Trustee Shelagh Mahoney-McNamee '87 — the single largest by an alumna in the University's history — will have a significant impact on the University's athletics programs and the student experience on campus.

"This historic gift and naming of Fairfield's new arena is a significant milestone as the University continues its rise as an institution of national prominence, and a model of the

"I am grateful for the opportunity to give back to my alma mater, which has given me so much both personally and professionally, and to honor my father with this dedication. This new arena will be a hub of Stag spirit and tradition, school engagement, and lifelong memories for the entire University community. Go Stags!"

Following the Mahoney Arena naming announcement, students, administrators, alumni, Ttrustees, and special guests gathered for a Cornerstone Ceremony to commemorate the momentous day and fill a time capsule with mementos and heartfelt messages for future generations of Stags to access.

"This is so much more than a new building," Aliyah Seenauth '23, vice president for the Fairfield University Student Association, shared during her remarks at the Cornerstone Ceremony. "This is a special place that will serve to further strengthen our campus community. I know that every time I enter the arena, I will be ecstatic to be in the company of my fellow Stags, celebrating achievement, building connections, and bonding with others who are so proud to be tied to Fairfield."

The Leo D. Mahoney Arena is scheduled to open on November 18, 2022 with a women's basketball game against Stonehill College. The men's basketball team will play their first game in the Arena on Saturday, December 3 against Saint Peters.

Leo D. Mahoney and his loving wife of 46 years, Joan E. Mahoney, were the children of Irish immigrants and did not attend college themselves. Leo and Joan's belief in the importance of Jesuit education and their Catholic values led them to support all three of their children, Shelagh Mahoney '87, Meghan Mahoney '89, and Patrick
